DIRECTOR'S NOTES - CODY ESTLE

NEXTACT

In 2007, I went to see THE SAVAGES, a film starring Laura Linney and Philip Seymour Hoffman, at a movie theatre in Cincinnati, Ohio. The movie centers around two estranged siblings who must come together to care for their elderly father. While watching, it struck me for the first time that there would inevitably come a day when I would have to care for my own parents. As an only child, I couldn't help but feel the weight of that responsibility. Unlike the characters in the film who had each other for support, I knew that when the time came for me, the burden would fall solely on my shoulders.

Max Posner's play THE TREASURER delves deep into these same themes: complexities of family dynamics, aging, and obligation. The play centers around the character of Ida Armstrong, an elderly woman navigating the twilight years of her life with a mixture of stubbornness and vulnerability. As her health begins to decline, Ida's son steps in to take on the role of her financial caretaker, a responsibility that dredges up unresolved tensions and emotional baggage from their past. What sets THE TREASURER apart is how the play is about absence. The absence of one's mother in childhood. The absence of feelings for a parent, especially when it seems everyone has feelings for their parents.

In many respects, THE TREASURER serves as a reflection of universal familial experiences, urging us to confront the realities of caregiving with candor and openness. While the prospect may seem daunting, the play underscores that within the void lies potential for growth, understanding, and even forgiveness. As I navigate my own journey, I carry the lessons gleaned from both THE SAVAGES and THE TREASURER, recognizing that while the road ahead may be challenging, it also offers moments of profound connection and grace.

IN THE LOOP





We have great news for patrons who require a hearing boost while attending our shows. Longtime supporter Milan Racic honored his beloved late wife Gordana with a generous memorial gift. Milan's donation was used to install a state-of-the-art Induction Loop listening system at Next Act. (The black striping you see on the theatre's floor along the front rows is part of the new system.) This greatly improves the listening experience for patrons who have special "T-coil" hearing aids, as well as for those who rely upon conventional sound augmentation. The

Loop replaces our older radio signal system, offering a much better quality of sound with far less background noise.

T-coil listeners simply need to switch their aids to the Loop setting. For conventional listeners, handy receiver packs with headphones are available at the Concessions Counter. The same strong sound will be available through either method of listening. We hope you take advantage of this terrific improvement and enjoy Next Act's intimate brand of theatre even more!

AUDIO LOOP INSTRUCTIONS

T-Coil Listeners: Simply set your hearing device to the Loop setting and enjoy the show.

Conventional Listeners: Check out a receiver and headphone set at the Concessions Counter. The House Manager can instruct you on its use, but here are some simple instructions.

Like a transistor radio, the small box has an off-on and volume knob; turn on and adjust for your comfort level. You will need to be seated in the theatre to receive the Loop signal.

The box works directionally; that is, it matters which way it is pointing.

- In most of our seating, the box works best when held up straight, with the volume knob on top, and the flat back pointing toward the stage.
- In the front rows, you will get the strongest signal with the box laying flat on your leg, with the flat back pointing straight to the floor.

Please ask the House Manager for assistance, if needed. We hope you enjoy the show.

MAX POSNER (Playwright)

Max Posner's productions include THE TREASURER (Playwrights Horizons, directed by David Cromer), JUDY (Page 73, directed by Ken Rus Schmoll), GUN LOGISTICS (Drama League, directed by Knud Adams), SNORE (Juilliard, directed by Knud Adams), and SISTERS ON THE GROUND (NYU Tisch, directed by Ken Rus Schmoll). Max suffers from multiple sclerosis, a diagnosis that informs his newest plays THE POOL (TBA, directed by Sarah Benson) and HANNUKAH SPECTACULAR (TBA, directed by David Cromer), which was recently developed in residency at the Berkeley Rep Ground Floor starring Kate Berlant. He is a Sundance Institute Fellow, recipient of a Heideman Award, a Helen Merrill Emerging Playwright Award, the Page 73 Fellowship, three MacDowell Fellowships, an Edgerton Foundation New Play Award and two Le Compte du Nuoy Awards from Lincoln Center. He graduated from Brown University (Weston Award for Playwriting) and completed a two-year Lila Acheson Wallace Fellowship at Juilliard. Alum of I73, the Soho Rep Writer-Director Lab, The Working Farm at Space and Ars Nova's Playgroup. He has commissions for Lincoln Center Theater, Williamstown, The Denver Center, Manhattan Theatre Club, Clubbed Thumb and Audible. For Film/TV, Max is adapting Percival Everett's novel So Much Blue into a screenplay to be directed by artist Rashid Johnson. He contributed to John Early's episode of THE CHARACTERS (Netflix). He conceived and wrote the libretto to SINGING IN A CHORUS, AGE 14 + LYING IN A FIELD, AGE 67 for the Brooklyn Youth Chorus (Premiere at BAM, National Sawdust). Max also completed a translation of THREE SISTERS by Anton Chekhov (with Russian scholar Ilya Khodosh). Max lives in Brooklyn, New York with Sarah DeLappe, their cat Zander and dog Joan. Proud member of the Writer's Guild of America East (WGAE) and the Dramatists Guild of America (DGA).



CODY ESTLE (Director, Artistic Director)

FOOD AND BEVERAGES – Drinks purchased at Next Act Theatre may be taken into the theatre, but food is not permitted.

ENTERING AND EXITING THE THEATRE SPACE – Please use walkways to access the seating areas and refrain from crossing over the stage.

CANCELLATION POLICY – Next Act does not cancel or reschedule performances due to inclement weather or sporting events, nor do we offer refunds in these circumstances. Any cancellations due to COVID-19 will be handled with ticketholders on a case-by-case basis.

LATECOMER POLICY – Latecomers will not be seated until an appropriate time in the performance. This may be at the intermission. *Seating may not be permitted 30 minutes after the start of a performance. If you are running late, please call the Ticket Office at 414-278-0765.*

HEARING LOOP LISTENING SYSTEM – The theatre is equipped with an advanced technology Hearing Loop listening system. The system will broadcast directly to those with T-coil hearing aids. Portable assistive listening devices for conventional listening are also available and may be checked out at the Concessions Counter.

LOST PROPERTY – Items left at the theatre are kept in Lost & Found for 30 days. Call the Ticket Office at 414-278-0765 if you have lost an item.

TICKET EXCHANGES – Subscribers may exchange their tickets, without fee, up to 48 hours prior to the performance (price adjustments may apply). Single ticket buyers may exchange their tickets for a fee of \$5 per ticket up to 48 hours prior. Exchanges are based strictly on availability. Patrons are strongly urged to request exchanges well in advance.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES – NO cameras or recording devices of any kind are allowed in the theatre. Please turn off all electronic equipment including cell phones.

SMOKING - The Next Act Theatre facility is a smoke-free environment.

DISCOUNTS – Seniors, educators, veterans and active service members receive a \$5 discount per ticket on advance sales. Students receive a ticket rate of \$15 plus fees for all performances. Individuals may also purchase half-price rush tickets one half-hour prior to curtain, based on availability. Discounts are not available on performance run extensions.
