

# **AUDIO LOOP INSTRUCTIONS**





**T-Coil Listeners:** Simply set your hearing device to the Loop setting and enjoy the show.

**Conventional Listeners:** Check out a receiver and headphone set at the Concessions Counter. The House Manager can instruct you on its use, but here are some simple instructions.

Like a transistor radio, the small box has an off-on and volume knob; turn on and adjust for your comfort level. You will need to be in the seats to receive the Loop signal.

The box works directionally; that is, it matters which way it is pointing.

- In most of our seating, the box works best when held up straight, with the
  volume knob on top, and the flat back pointing toward the stage.
- In the front rows, you will get the strongest signal with the box laying flat on your leg, with the flat back pointing straight to the floor.

Please ask the House Manager for assistance, if needed. We hope you enjoy the show.

Our Induction Loop listening system was a gift from longtime supporter Milan Racic, honoring his beloved late wife Gordana. Special thanks are also due to Nancy Einhorn for her advocacy and support of this project.

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

# MARIE KOHLER (Playwright)

Marie Kohler is a Milwaukee-based playwright, director, writer and producer. Her plays have earned nominations for the Susan Smith Blackburn Prize, the Harold and Mimi Steinberg/American Theatre Critics Association New Play Award and Citations, the Abingdon Theatre Reading Series (finalist), the Todd McNerney Playwriting Award (finalist), Playwrights First Best New Play Award (semi-finalist) and the Playwrights' Center PlayLabs Festival (semi-finalist). Her play BOSWELL captured four-star reviews at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe and went on to a sold-out off-Broadway run at 59E59 Theaters (2022), MIDNIGHT AND MOLL FLANDERS, among her other plays, earned "Best of the Year" reviews. Marie's published plays include A GIRL OF THE LIMBERLOST, BOSWELL and MIDNIGHT AND MOLL FLANDERS. She has also written THE DIG and THE WITCH'S HOUSE. Kohler co-founded Renaissance Theaterworks and proudly served as co-artistic director and resident playwright there for 20 years. (In 2005, Renaissance produced an earlier version of this play: BOSWELL'S DREAMS.) The Milwaukee Arts Board named her both "Artist of the Year" and "Friend of the Arts." Marie earned her bachelor's degree at Harvard University and her master's degree at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. She has served on the Wisconsin Humanities Council and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside Arts and Humanities Board. She and her husband Brian Mani-for whom she wrote the role of Samuel Johnson in BOSWELL—happily share three daughters and eight grandchildren. So much gratitude to Next Act Theatre for producing this play!



LATECOMER POLICY – Latecomers will not be seated until an appropriate time. Seating will not be permitted 30 minutes after the start of a performance. If you are running late, please call the Ticket Office at 414-278-0765.

TICKET EXCHANGES – Subscribers may exchange their tickets, without fee, up to 48 hours prior to the performance (price adjustments may apply). Single ticket buyers may exchange their tickets for a fee of \$5 per ticket up to 48 hours prior.


ELECTRONIC DEVICES – Photography and videography of any kind are prohibited during this performance. Please turn off all cell phones and other electronic devices.
