History 1990-2024

A Wrinkle in Time, 1990

Founded in 1990 after the merging of Next
Generation Theatre and Theatre Tesseract, Next Act
Theatre began with a modest subscriber base of
1,000. Our early seasons were met with critical
acclaim, though our nomadic playing spaces
proved to be a challenge for attracting new
audiences. By early 2000, the Off-Broadway
Theatre was established, along with a
dedicated rehearsal space, in
Milwaukee's Third Ward.

1997 marked the beginning of our Next Actors: Summer Theatre for Teens program, which recently celebrated its 26th year. Next Actors is a free-of-charge program that gives up to 30 students the opportunity to experience playwriting and performance with the guidance of professional teaching artists, culminating in a week-long performance tour to community and senior centers and a final benefit performance here at Next Act.

In 2011, we were thrilled to complete construction on the dedicated 152-seat space that we now occupy in Milwaukee's Harbor District. Within four seasons in the new space, Next Act had retired all construction debt. In recent seasons we have continued to grow into our new space, completed theatre improvement projects, and welcomed new patrons.

In the 2022-23 season, David Cecsarini retired as Producing Artistic Director, a role he had held at the theatre for 30 years, handing the reins to current Artistic Director Cody Estle. Early in the 2023-24 season, longtime Next Act staff member Libby Amato was promoted to the position of Managing Director, which had been left vacant since the passing of longtime Managing Director, Charles Kakuk.

Next Act Theatre continues to offer a four-production season of compelling and thought-provoking plays, enjoying a loyal and growing patron base. The company is particularly noted for our acting excellence, accessible performance style and a varied and consistently interesting selection of stories. Next Act has mounted more than 100 main stage productions, many of them being area premieres, and seven original scripts.

Season Programming

Our 34th Season opened with Kia Corthron's **SPLASH HATCH ON THE E GOING DOWN**. Directed by Cheryl
Lynn Bruce and featuring Jada Jackson, Joseph Brown Jr.,
James Carrington, Kristin E. Ellis, and Malaina Moore,
SPLASH HATCH was sponsored by J. Michael Reavis and
Judges John and Jean DiMotto.

During the run, Next Act offered our second ever Black Out Night for a nearly sold-out, all black-identifying audience. The performance was followed by a reception catered by Mobay Cafe, a local black-owned business, and featured a talkback allowing members of the audience to share their thoughts and experiences.

Additional talkbacks, featured partnerships with African American Roundtable, Alice's Garden, Black

Opening in November, Agatha Christie's **THE MOUSETRAP** quickly became the highest-grossing production in Next Act's history. Directed by Mary MacDonald Kerr, THE MOUSETRAP featured Lillian Brown, Josh Krause, Rudy Galvan, Margaret Casey, Doug Jarecki, Libby Amato,

Jonathan Gillard Daly, and Casey Hoekstra, and was sponsored by Jan Serr and John Shannon, and Sandra Zingler.

Next Act offered our first ever Bookclub Night and welcomed Dr. Christopher Chan, an International Goodwill Ambassador for Agatha Christie Limited, to many of the show's talkbacks.

Education & Outreach

Next Actors, Summer Theatre for Teens

Next Actors 2023 served an intimate and focused group of students. Each student was able to take the lead on their own short play, and the finale performance consisted of all three short pieces. The plays featured strong themes of fantasy and found family and was aptly entitled: "Belonging Shouldn't Be a Fantasy."

This was Education Manager Pia Russo's first summer managing Next Actors after taking up her position in earnest in January 2023. The 2023-24 Next Actors also saw the return of long-time Next Actor Ryleigh Carrol - this time as a mentor! Pia and Riley were also joined by Teaching Assistant Kelsie Kasky, an Senior Education Student at Marquette University.

The students collaborated to create a variety show of short plays that highlighted the importance of found family and being your authentic self. The show toured to various senior and community centers for a week before taking its' final bow in Next Act's theatre in front of family, friends, and supporters.

Student Matinees, Workshops, and Community Project


Our high school matinee series provides low- to no-cost performances for each production in our season that is age-appropriate. This year, we welcomed 179 students from Hamilton, Rufus King, Reagan, Oak Creek, and Cudahy High Schools to **SPLASH HATCH ON THE E GOING DOWN** and **SCARECROW**.

440 students participated in pre- and post-show workshops meant to help deepen their understanding of the play. Kia Corthron's SPLASH HATCH ON THE E GOING DOWN served as our student community project this year; students were asked to write either a letter to the playwright or a short sequel to SPLASH HATCH. The letters were sent to playwright Kia Corthron, and some of the students were treated to a reading of their plays by Jada Jackson and Malaina Moore, two actors from the show.

Talkbacks and Personal Previews

Next Act offers talkbacks and pre-show chats throughout the season. Next Act Staff and artists hosted many of the informal discussions, often including guest speakers from relevant fields to provide insight into issues discussed in the plays. Talkbacks this year included guests from:

Newsletters and Communication

Communication with our patrons is a top priority. Next Act publishes five newsletters per year highlighting our upcoming productions with articles that focus on why plays were chosen, background information on playwrights and the play's subject matter. Highlights also include upcoming rental performances, development and marketing updates, and information about special events. The newsletter is mailed and emailed to our patrons. Next Act maintains a Facebook page, an Instagram account, Tiktok, a YouTube account, and a website, www.nextact.org, for quick and up-to-date information. Patrons receive regular email blasts with pertinent information to make the Next Act experience more enjoyable. After every performance, attendees receive an email message asking for feedback about the show and their experience at the theatre.

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion

Next Act welcomes emerging artists of color to participate in paid internships in the areas of directing, stage management, design, or administration. Interns have the opportunity to work one-on-one in a professional environment, learning from those with expertise in each field. The goal of the program is to help nurture the careers of these young artists, provide networking opportunities and encourage emerging artists to keep Milwaukee as their home base. 2023-24 IEO interns included Dr. Mohammad ElBsat (Directing, THE TREASURER) and Martilia Marechal (Sound Design, THE MOUSETRAP).

Fundraising & Development

Next Act was incredibly pleased to meet or exceed all of our 2023-24 fundraising goals. In addition to our planned activities, we were also grateful to receive anonymous funds for special projects. over so many years.


